

Opening Course Search

- 1. From the EIU website, login to PAWS with your network ID and password.
- 2. Click on the Student tab at the top.




3. Then click on Registration in the menu that appears.




4. You will need to click the Continue button on the next page to confirm that you have read and understand EIU's Sexual Harassment and Discrimination policies.

5. On the next screen, click Look Up Classes.




6. Use the drop-down menu to select the term you want and click the Continue button.




Performing a Simple Search

Enter Search Criteria. For example, we want to find ENG 1002G: College Composition II.

1. You can start typing a subject and then selecting it from the menu.



2. Then pick your course number. Be sure to include the G on the end if it is a Gen Ed class.



3. You usually can skip the Keyword field and click Search.

Reading the Course Search Results


The results for a Course Search contain a lot of information, so let's review.



- 1. Title The title of the course, such as "College Composition II."
- 2. Subject Description The subject of the course, such as "English."
- 3. Course Number The number of the course, such as 1002G.
- 4. Section Each section of a course offered gets its own number. Section numbers have significance and may indicate whether a course is restricted to students in fully online programs.
- 5. Hours The number of credits for the course.
- 6. CRN The course registration number for the course, a unique 5-digit code that identifies the exact course and section in the database.
- 7. Term The term these courses are offered, such as Spring 2026.
- 8. Instructor The instructor assigned to the course.
- 9. Meeting Times The days, times, and location(s) the course meets.
- 10. Campus The EIU campus where the course is taught. Most courses, even online sections, are considered part of the main campus in Charleston, Illinois, but EIU does teach courses at other locations for specific programs.
- 11. Status The number of open seats remaining of total seats in the course displayed as "X of Y seats remain." For example, a section with 17 open seats out of 23 total would display "17 of 23 seats remain."
- 12. Schedule Type The type of course, such as "Lecture," "Lab," "Internship," or "Online."
- 13. Attribute Extra information about the course that may be useful, such as whether it fits into any General Education category or is Writing Intensive.

Performing an Advanced Search

- 1. Open the Course Search screen and select your term (see Opening Course Search).
- 2. Click on the Advanced Search link.




Instructor Searches

1. To find all courses taught by a specific professor, start typing the professor's name in the Instructor field of an Advanced Search and choose the option or options that meet your criteria. In our example, we looked for courses taught by Dr. Stowell.




2. The results displayed five courses taught by Dr. Stowell.




Gen Ed Searches

1. To find all courses that meet the Gen Ed Humanities requirement, use an Advanced Search to look for Gen Ed Humanities in the Attribute box.




2. The results show 24 courses that all have the Gen Ed Humanities Attribute.



Schedule Type Searches (Face-to-Face and Online)

 To find all online courses offered for the term, use the Schedule Type field with an Advanced Search. You can select multiple options, and we chose to look for courses labeled as "Online" or "Online-no real time virtual mt" to find online classes where we did not have to be online at a specific day and time.



2. The results displayed 336 classes that are online for the specified term.

Part of Term Searches

 To find courses that are in the second half of the term, we performed an Advanced Search using the Part of Term field and looking for Second Half Term.



2. The results included 52 classes.

Search Only Open Sections

You can limit any search to only sections that still have seats by using an Advanced Search and checking the box for Open Sections Only at the bottom of the page.



Combining Advanced Search Fields

If we wanted to find an online class that meets the Gen Ed Humanities requirement that still had seats open, we would use and Advanced Search plus use

- 1. the Attribute field to search for Gen Ed Humanities (see <u>Gen Ed Searches</u>),
- 2. the Schedule Type field to search for Online (see <u>Schedule Type Searches</u>), and
- 3. a check in the box for Open Sections Only (see <u>Search Only Open Sections</u>).
- 4. The Advanced Search found one class that meets our needs.
