I. Call to Order

III. Chair Selection

Current Co-chairs will remain in this position through the year. In the spring, there will be a new slate elected for the fall.

IV. Review of Retention Data

Reviewed updated retention report prepared with highlighted trends.

- Undeclared students: -8% retention rate; flagged as high-risk group.
- Athletes: -8.5%, Impact from transfer portal.
- Business & Technology: -7.5, Large drop noted; discussion about internal transfers vs. leaving.
- Non-Pell students: -4.7%, Struggles with funding; scholarship redistribution discussed.
- Demographic shifts: Black/African American and White student numbers are both down.
 - o Black/African American: -3.9%
 - o White: -3.3%
- Suggestion made to track and compile data of students registered for EIU 1111.
- P.A.C.K: -1.2%
- Overall, Freshman Retention: 68.1% (-3.2% from FA24)

V. Identifying Workgroups

- Amber Webb proposed Panthers Persist model: Modeled after the University of Oklahoma "Coaching to Complete" which is an academic life coaching.
- Proposal to create a similar multi-tiered "Panthers Persist" model and have it housed in the Academic Support Center.

VII. EAB Navigate Update

VIII. Story about Student Success from Dr. Chris Laingen

- Dr. Laingen shared with Danny their insights from his spring course data highlighting student disengagement patterns.
- Boxes shaded in red meant the student did not submit an assignment.
- 27% of all quizzes, labs, and participation points were not attempted by the students.
- Dr. Laingen estimated that if students would submit assignments, they would have 6 more A's and B's and 10 fewer D's and F's than he submitted for.
