Meeting #2 – Dues Structure

- Extensive discussion regarding changing the fee structure to benefit institutions
 - O The argument has been made that smaller schools, such as Eastern Illinois University, pay the same amount as large schools, such as Ohio State University. Some graduate organizations see this as unfair, since larger schools have more resources with which to pay the dues and receive more benefits since they have a larger student population.
 - The suggestion was made that a sliding scale be implemented for the next membership year. A variety of tables were presented.
 - The committee voted to present the following information to the Executive Board:
 - \$100 Starting Organizations, all sizes
 - \$250 Schools with graduate populations > 3,499
 - \$350 Schools with graduate populations 3,500 7,999
 - \$500 Schools with graduate populations 8,000 +
 - Information on status of dues structure not known at time of departure.
