Through client-based projects and an internship, students will build a professional portfolio that demonstrates their writing, editing, design, and research skills to prospective employers.

Students planning to enroll for Eng 4275, Internship in Professional Writing, must consult with Dr. Fredrick as early as possible regarding an internship placement best suited to the student's individual needs.
