ADDITIONAL EMERGENCY INFORMATION:

Department's Evacuation Signal and Reassemble Points for Terrorism and Bomb Threats

General Alarm Signal Method to Evacuate: FPM is notified by the University Police Department regarding terrorism and/or bomb threats. All Craft shops will be notified via the 2-way radio system of situation and instructed to take the appropriate steps to evacuate.

Department's Evacuation Routes for Chemical Spills, Fires

An Emergency Assembly Point (EAP) is a place for your department members to gather during an emergency or after a disaster to take roll, organize rescue, first aid, and support teams. EAP for FPM: Parking lot West of the North and South buildings.

Shelter for Severe Weather/Earthquakes

Occupants should move to the main or lower floor as quickly as possible. If time does not allow for movement, cover should be taken away from glass and under protective items such as tables. Once individuals have reached the shelter/ "take cover" locations, they should assume a seated position on the floor with their heads down and their hands over their heads or place themselves under a desk or between fixed seating, if it is available, with heads lower than the backs of the seats. If they are wearing heavy clothing or have access to heavy clothing, they should use these items to cover up their bodies and heads. Hallways and stairwells are also acceptable shelters/ "take cover" areas. Once the disaster area is stabilized, exit from the building to the Emergency Assembly Point.

Shelter-In-Place, Barricade In Place

The building occupants should proceed to the nearest available room in which you can take shelter. Once you are there...

- a. Lock the door
- b. Shut the curtains/blinds covering the windows
- c. Sit/crouch down in areas that are out of sight from doors and windows
- d. Take roll call, including the names of any visitors
- e. Turn off the lights and remain quiet and calm
- f. Do not open the door for anybody!

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
