BACKGROUND



Administration Protocol

- All institutions of higher education were invited to participate – Fall 2009
- Invitation packets sent to Presidents, announcements through list-serves
- Informational Meeting at December Affiliates Meeting



Administration Protocol

- Schools were allowed option of CORE Long Form or Community College Form
- Schools were allowed option of paper or electronic administration
- Schools were asked to collect surveys between February 1 – May 1

- 29 institutions participated
- 23 bachelors and master's level institutions, and 6 community colleges participated




Demographics

- 4,096 from 4-year Master's Degree Granting Institutions




Demographics - Ethnicity






Ethnicity by Institution Type






Demographics - Gender





Gender by Institution Type






Average # of Drinks Per Week*






Binge Drinking





Binge Drinking By Institution Type*




Binge Drinking by Gender*




Ave. Drinks/Week by Group Affiliation – Risk*






Ave. Drinks/Week by Group Affiliation – Protective*








Reported Grade and Drinks/Week






Reported Grade and Binge Drinking






Reported Grade and Hangover*






Reported Grade and Lower Test Scores*






Reported Grade and Missed Class*






Reported Grade and Trouble with Police*






Reported Grade and Property Damage*






Reported Grade and Argument/Fights*






Reported Grade and Driving Impaired*






Reported Grade and DUI Arrest*






Age Grouping






Ave. Drinks/Week by Age






Ave. Drinks/Week by <21, 21-24, & 25+*






Binge Drinking By Age*






Age Grouping & Hangover*






Age Grouping & Lower Test Scores*






Age Grouping & Missed a Class*






Age Grouping & Trouble with Police*






Age Grouping & Property Damage*






Age Grouping & Arguments/Fight*






Age Grouping & Driving Impaired*






Age Grouping & DUI Arrest*
