APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

1. WHAT CAN I EXPECT FROM A SLO GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIP?

Many duties and responsibilities will serve to compliment your academic coursework while exposing you as a Graduate Assistant to experiential learning opportunities that facilitate your own personal growth and professional development.

3. WHEN DOES THE SLO GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIP BEGIN EACH YEAR?

Student Life Office Graduate Assistantship contracts begin on August 1, 2021 - April 30, 2022.

4. WHEN ARE GRADUATE PROGRAM APPLICATIONS DUE?

Completed Counseling and Student Development Program credentials should be on file by March 1 in order to receive full consideration for fall admission. Only a limited number of EIU Graduate Students are selected based on qualifications and experience. Applicants are encouraged to apply by February and the preferred deadline. Applicants planning to attend College Student Affairs Days in February should submit complete credentials by the February deadline.

- Bachelor's degree and admittance into Eastern Illinois
 University Counseling and Student Development graduate program or any master's degree level program
 within university.
- Undergraduate GPA of at least 2.75 (on 4.0 scale) and MAT or GRE scores (if required by graduate program).
- Maintain full-time graduate student status in accordance with the EIU graduate school and degree program of study.
- Willingness to work evenings, nights and weekends required.
- Excellent written and oral communications skills.
- Effective organizational, event planning and supervisory skills.
- Demonstrated ability to work with and advise students/student groups of diverse cultural backgrounds; sensitivity to and appreciation of campus diversity a must.
- Ability to multitask in a fast-paced, innovative, and ever-changing work environment.
- Interest in, and working knowledge of, student leadership, advisement and development.

GRADUATE ASSISTANT DESCRIPTION

The Student Life Office (SLO) Graduate Assistant is an administrative position committed to the development, supervision, and evaluation of student programming, leadership development, and student organizations. In addition, SLO Graduate Assistants play a key role in all departmental and divisional staff meetings, orientations and training, and provides administrative staff support to SLO initiatives, services and programs.



ELIGIBILITY

An applicant must have earned a Bachelor's degree with a minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA or on the last 60 semester hours of graded academic coursework and demonstrate the ability to matriculate into a master's degree program within the university. Applicants must be fully admitted to the EIU Graduate School and a Graduate Degree Program as a degree candidate beginning an approved program of study. Prospective candidates will be chosen based upon programming knowledge, applicable skill-set and experiences as they relate to Student Life areas that include, but are not limited to programming board, multicultural programs, student government, leadership development, major and special events planning and other related programming experiences.

An applicant submitting an application for a SLO Graduate Assistantship must either be enrolled in the Counseling and Student Development (CSD) graduate program or admission to a Master's degree-level graduate study program at EIU. Recipients of Student Life Office Graduate Assistantship position must maintain a 3.0 GPA, carry a minimum of 9 course hours per semester and satisfactorily perform their assistantship assigned duties.

SUPERVISION AND AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITIES

The (5) SLO Graduate Assistants work under the direct advisement and supervision of the Director of Student Life, with additional supervision by SLO Staff.

Primary areas of responsibility include staff advisement of the University Board campus entertainment, iLEAD. Leadership Support Services, Multicultural Programs – Black Student Union, Latin American Student Organization, Diversity Advisory Council (DAC) and Learning by Example to Accept Diversity (L.E.A.D.), EIU Student Government, and All Staff university events – major Concerts, New Student Mixer, Quakin' the Quad, Up All Nights, First Night, Pantherpalooza, Homecoming Week, Family Weekend, Pantherstock, and other duties as assigned. Other responsibilities will include providing administrative staff support and other duties assigned to the SLO.

BENEFITS

- STIPEND \$9,000 per 9-month contract (\$1,000/month)
- TUITION WAIVER 9-15 hours of Graduate Tuition are
 waived each semester. Graduate Assistants must enroll in
 a minimum of 9 hours each semester (3 hrs. in the summer)
 and maintain a 3.0 semester cumulative GPA. Graduate assistants may be eligible for state and federal aid programs.
 SLO Graduate Assistants may apply for Summer Tuition
 Waivers.

EIU students receiving graduate assistantships are required to pay applicable student fees that are not covered by the award package: i.e., health service, activity/sports/rec., athletic fees, textbook rental, etc.
