B. Contractual Agreement for Teamsters

Contract Renewal and Successor Agreement General Teamsters Local Union 26 Champaign, Illinois and Vicinity

Labor Agreement: A tentative agreement was reached between the parties on

November 21, 2022 to renew a successor contract for 3

years. There are approximately 11 members. The Teamsters ratified the agreement on January 4, 2023. The agreement is effective July

1, 2022 through June 30, 2025.

Cost of Settlement: The Union agreed to a raise of 3.25% for covered members

in FY 2023, a raise of 2% in FY 2024, and a raise of 2% in FY

2025.

Estimated Cost of Increases: \$35,314.50 over the life of the agreement

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the Successor Agreement.

C. Sarah Bush Lincoln Contract

The Administration will be recommending an agreement between Eastern Illinois University and Sarah Bush Lincoln for the management and provision of healthcare services for students in the University Health Center. The financial terms will be provided as an Addendum.

D. Emeritus Designation

Past EIU presidents have been awarded the "Emeritus" distinction. The item will be brought to the board for its consideration. This distinction does not have any financial impact to the university.

E. Personnel Contract

President Glassman intends to return to faculty upon his retirement from the presidency. To avoid a conflict-of-interest, the board will review and approve a contract for his first term as faculty while maintaining his role as tenured Professor for the University.

EIU investments may also include U.S. Treasury Notes, Government Agencies (e.g., Federal Home Loan Bank, FNMA, etc), Money Market Funds, Depository Accounts and Commercial Paper. Earnings rates for the quarter ranged from 2.88% to 4.12%

Financial Aid Programs Report

More than sixty percent of Eastern's student body received some type of financial assistance in FY 2022 in the form of scholarships, grants, loans, tuition waivers and/or employment, from various federal, state, university, and other programs. Financial aid in FY 2022 totaled \$89,523,594 at Eastern, an increase of \$5,144,600 or 6.10% over FY 2021. The percentage breakdown of financial aid sources is as follows: 50% federal, 12% state, 29% institutional, and 8% other.
